Children's Classes and Choirs

K-2 is our Wednesday Afternoon program for our K-2nd graders. K2 children will journey through the Bible, learning over 70 stories from the Old and New Testaments during their 3 years.

Acolytes is our Wednesday afternoon program for our 3rd–5th graders. Acolytes will journey through their faith focusing on what we believe as Presbyterians, elements of worship and much more. Acolytes begin participating during worship by bringing the light of Christ into the church and taking the light of Christ out of the church.

The Gloria Choir is for children ages 3 and 4. This choir focuses on introducing the joy of music to our youngest members as they learn the basics of music.
